




The implication from the serpent seems to be that God is keeping something from them. If they would simply disobey God, a whole new world of knowledge and wisdom would be available to them.

“Man is wired so he gets his glory (his security, his understanding of value, his feeling of purpose, his feeling of rightness with his Maker, his security for eternity) from God, and this relationship is so strong, and God’s love is so pure, that Adam and Eve felt no insecurity at all, so much so that they walked around naked and didn’t even realize that they were naked. But when that relationship was broken, they knew it instantly. All of their glory, the glory that came from God, was gone. It wouldn’t be unlike being in love and having somebody love you and then all of a sudden that person is gone, like a kid lost in the store. All of the insecurity rises the instant you realize you are alone. No insecurity was felt when the person who loved you was around, but in his absence, it instantly comes to the surface. In this way, Adam and Eve were naked and weren’t ashamed when God was around, but the second the relationship was broken, they realized it and were ashamed.”

GOD'S JUDGMENTS:

THE SERPENT: Literal, physical judgment on serpents and a promise to Satan that he would one day be crushed by someone who would come in the line of Adam and Eve.

The Protoevangelium—The First _____.

“As God pronounced judgment on the serpent (Satan, see Rev. 12:9;20:2), He declared that the seed of the woman would execute this very judgment. Note that seed here is singular—it references a specific descendent. It later becomes evident that this promise would provide the means to restore the fellowship between God and His created beings.” - Christopher Cone, *The Promises of God*

THE WOMAN:

- The woman was originally intended by God to be the man's helper. One of the main ways that she would help him accomplish His God given task of exercising dominion on the earth was to bear him children. Bearing and raising these children was to be a joyous and worshipful experience. It would now be a process of pain and toil.
- Also, her sinful tendency now will be to usurp the authority of her husband rather than rest in the security it was intended to provide her.

THE MAN:

- God gave the man dominion over the earth to work and keep it. This was to be work that was joyous and worshipful. The ground was now cursed and would require strain and toil to bring forth food for the man. This life of toil and labor would also eventually kill him.
- His sinful tendency would also be to abdicate his authority and responsibility or to misuse or abuse it.

An Acceptable Covering—Genesis 3:21

- God did not accept their attempt to cover themselves
- He killed an animal and clothed them with it's skin.
- This is the first death in scripture and was necessary to cover their guilt. (Heb. 9:22)

1. Satan (Gen. 3:1,4)
2. Sin (Gen. 3:6-13)
3. Death (Gen. 3:22-24)

JESUS DEFEATS _____—Colossians 2:13-15

And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

JESUS FREES US FROM _____—Romans 8:1-4

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

JESUS CONQUERS _____—1 Corinthians 15:20-26

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.
