The Fear of the Lord

"17 And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile ..."

God as Father and Judge:

"Fear"—

- ⇒ Used in the O.T. of a proper relationship to Yahweh: *Ps. 34:11, Prov. 1:7, 9:10, Jer. 2:19*
- ⇒ Used in the N.T. in a similar way: Acts 9:31, 2 Cor. 5:11, Phil. 2:12

"...¹⁸ knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot."

Ransomed—λυτρόω (lytroō)— "to redeem; to liberate by payment of a ransom."
