The Enduring Character of God's Word

²⁴ for "All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, ²⁵ but the word of the Lord remains forever." And this word is the good news that was preached to you.
⇒ The Quotation: Isaiah 40:6,8
\Rightarrow The Gospel proclaimed to them <u>is</u> the Word of the Lord.
What is Peter doing in this passage?
Peter wants Christians to understand how vitally important it is for us to one another in light of what God has done in our lives through Christ by the power of His Word.
Some things to consider:
Jesus is the mediator of all of a Christian's, but particularly those with our fellow believers.
Christians are to love one another in ways because this is how we have been loved by Christ.
• Love for our brothers and sisters in Christ serves as a to the surrounding world that the Gospel is true and affects real change in people's lives.
Love for one another serves as an to us during this time of our exile.
