Before we came to Christ we had no part in the promises of God. As Christians, we are now part of God's people through Christ. He has secured for us an inheritance (1:4) and made us a part of all that God had predicted through the prophets (1:11). We should live holy lives now (1:16) because God has chosen us and made us His. Knowing this privileged position helps Christians to further understand how to live during our time of exile.

<u>Christ, the Living Stone</u>—1 Peter 2:4-8

⁴ As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, ⁵ you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ.

• The scriptural basis: Is. 28:16
⇒ Christ is the <i>cornerstone</i> .
Christians are not put to shame because they have been chosen in Christ.
\Rightarrow His honor is <i>imputed</i> to Christians.
but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone," ⁸ and "A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.
• Ironically, ultimate dishonor is reserved for those who reject Christ and dishonor His people.
