Peter's Exhortation: [poimain**ō**] the flock of God! This exhortation recalls Jesus' last words to Peter in John 21:15-19, " my sheep." Peter's Qualifications: \Rightarrow He is a fellow *elder* [presbuteros]: ⇒ He is a fellow *witness* of Christ: \Rightarrow He is a fellow *partaker* of future glory: The Work of the Shepherd: Exercising *Oversight* [episkope**ō**]: ⇒ This includes watching, directing, and protecting their interests:

• H	le is to shepherd willingly rather than under constraint.
=	Oversight is to be performed with a due sense of to God
• H	le is to shepherd eagerly, but not for the sake of shameful gain. (1 Sam. 2:22-26; 8:1-5)
=	The goal of proper oversight is great gain for the rather than for the shepherd.
• H	le is to set an example for the flock rather than domineering over them.
=	> Proper oversight includes the of truth as well as its instruction and command.
	er-Shepherds & the Chief Shepherd: It is the Chief Shepherd who sets the example of faithful service and who will reward those who faithfully serve in caring for His sheep.

The Manner of the Shepherd's Oversight:
