# The Fourth Dispensation: "Promise" Or "Patriarchal Rule"

#### Review:

## The "Dispensations": Distinguishable Economies (Stages) in the Eternal Plan of God

#### I. "Innocence":

- A. "<u>Revelation</u>": Genesis 1:28 3:6.
  - → Time period = From the "creation" of mankind to the "fall" of man.
- B. "Responsibility": To maintain "innocence" by obeying God!
  - → "Rule of Life" = "Innocence"; a "positive holiness"; "fellowship" with God;
  - → Mankind was <u>responsible</u> to maintain this "sinless" standing;
  - → God's command: "Do not eat!" (Gen. 3:1).
- C. "Failure": Mankind failed the test!
  - → "They ate!"
  - → They chose to trust themselves rather than God!
- D. "Judgment": Spiritual and Physical "Death"!
  - → Adam and Eve were permanently removed from the garden;
  - → A "Curse" on all mankind and all creation!
- E. "Grace":
  - →God's provision for man's need in the person and work of Christ!
  - →God's promise of a Redeemer through the "seed" of the woman, Gen. 3:15.

Note: A new dispensation begins when there is a <u>change</u> in mankind's responsibility before God → some "old" aspects are removed; some are left; and some "new" aspects are added! Primarily there is a new "<u>Rule of Life</u>" (A new "governing principle").

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#### II. "Conscience":

- A. "Revelation": Genesis 4:1 8:14.
  - → Time period = from the "fall" of mankind to the universal "Flood".
- B. "Responsibility":
  - →To do what is right by "human conscience", Gen. 4:9
  - → To be governed by the "<u>restraint</u>" of the Holy Spirit, Gen. 6:3;
  - → To approach God by "blood sacrifice", Gen. 4:2-5.
  - → Note: Each of these "responsibilities" is a "A New "Rule of Life"!
- C. "Failure": Mankind failed the test!
  - → Universal "Wickedness"!

"Then the LORD saw that the <u>wickedness</u> of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only <u>evil</u> continually." Gen. 6:5

- D. "Judgment": The Worldwide "Flood" in the day of Noah!
  - → All mankind was destroyed except for the eight members of Noah's family.
- E. "Grace":
  - →God's provision for man's need in the person and work of Christ!

    "But Noah found favor (grace) in the eyes of the LORD . . . " (Gen. 6:8)
  - →God's provision of deliverance through the "Ark" of safety!

#### III. "Human Government":

- A. "Revelation": Genesis 8:15 11:9.
  - → Time period = From the worldwide "Flood" to the call of "Abraham".
- B. "Responsibility":
  - →To do what is right by "human conscience";
  - → To be governed by the "restraint" of the Holy Spirit;
  - → To approach God by "blood sacrifice".
  - →To "scatter" and "multiply" throughout earth, Gen. 9:7;
  - → A **New** "Rule of Life" = To live by submission to "human government"; To control violence and corruption by human "authority" – <u>capital punishment</u>, Gen. 9:6.
- C. "Failure": Mankind failed the test!

"The people, instead of obeying God's command to <u>scatter</u> and <u>fill the earth</u>, conceived the idea of staying together and building the 'Tower of Babel' to help achieve their aim. <u>Fellowship with man replaced fellowship with God</u>." --Charles Ryrie

- D. "Judgment": The "scattering" of mankind by the "confusion" of human language, Gen. 11:5-9.
- **E.** "Grace": God's provision for man's need in the person and work of Christ!
  - "... God graciously intervened in that <u>he did not utterly destroy</u> the nations but chose to **deal graciously** with Abraham and his descendants." --Charles Ryrie

#### IV. "Promise":

#### A. "Revelation": Genesis 11:10 – Exodus18:27.

→ Time period = from the call of "Abraham" to the giving of the Law to Moses.

"The title 'Promise' comes from Hebrews 6:15 and 11:9 where it is said that Abraham obtained the 'promise' and sojourned in the 'land of promise'.

... Until this dispensation ("Promise") all mankind had been directly related to God's governing principles. Now God marked out one family and one nation and in them made a representative test of all."

#### B. "Responsibility":

- →To do what is right by "human conscience";
- → To be governed by the "restraint" of the Holy Spirit;
- → To approach God by "blood sacrifice".
- →To control human behavior by the authority of "<u>human</u> government";
- → A new "Rule of Life": To be governed by faith in the "Promises" of God!

"The <u>special revelation</u> which God gave to Abraham and his descendants for the fourth dispensation is recorded in:

- --Genesis 12:1-3:
- --Genesis 13:14-17;
- --Genesis 15:7-21;
- --Genesis 17:1-22.

#### God made **personal promises** to Abraham:

- --He would bless him:
- --Make his name great;
- --Give him many physical descendants;
- --Make him the 'father' of a multitude of nations;
- --Give him the land of Canaan for an everlasting possession:
- --And bless those who blessed him and curse those who cursed him.

#### God made <u>national promises</u> concerning Israel:

- --He would bring Israel into existence as a nation;
- --Make it great;
- --Give Israel the land of Canaan forever:
- --And establish the Abrahamic Covenant with the nation as an everlasting covenant.

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#### God also made a universal promise:

--He would give blessing to all the families of the earth through Abraham's line of descent (the 'Redeemer' would come through Israel)."

#### C. "Failure":

"Abraham and his descendants <u>failed</u> the test of the fourth dispensation. On several occasions they <u>disobeyed</u> God as the result of lapses of faith concerning the fulfillment of His promises.

- --Abraham fathered Ishmael through Hagar. (Gen. 16:1-16)
- --Twice he lied concerning his wife Sarah. (Gen. 12:10-20; 20:1-18)
- --Isaac lied concerning Rebekah. (Gen. 26:6-11)
- --Jacob was a great deceiver. (Gen. 27:1-29)
- --The Jews did not return from Egypt to Canaan after the famine of Joseph's time ended. Apparently they forgot that their destiny was related to the <u>land</u> of Canaan rather than to Egypt." --R. Showers

#### D. "Judgment":

→ "Slavery" in Egypt.

"This failure brought <u>divine judgment</u>. Throughout their history the Jews have continued to have problems with Ishmael's descendants. Through time they were subjected to slavery and threatened with annihilation in Egypt."

#### E. "Grace":

- →God's provision for man's need in the person and work of Christ!
- →God sent a "<u>Deliverer</u>" → "<u>Moses</u>" to bring the "<u>Chosen People</u>" out of slavery and into the "Promised Land"! (Exodus 3:1-10)
