The Prophetic Word to the Churches Rev. 2:1—"To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: 'The words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand, who walks among the seven golden lampstands. "The words of..." — Τάδε λέγει (Tade legei) "Thus says" Zech. 1:3-4—³ And you will say to them, This is what the Lord Almighty says: Return to me, and I will return to you, says the Lord. ⁴ And do not be like your fathers, against whom the former prophets brought a charge, saying, "This is what the Lord Almighty says, 'Turn away from your evil ways and from your evil practices." And they gave no heed to listen to me, says the Lord. ⇒ These words are used to remind the church of Christ's work. The Vision of Christ: Christ's divine, work. Christ's Solution for the Church

Rev. 2:5a—Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first.

Observations:

- 1. The church is the recall the history of their relationship to Christ.
 - The birth of the church in Ephesus is recorded in Acts 18:18-28, 19:1-41. The church began with the preaching of the Gospel among the Jews, but quickly grew as gentiles came to faith in Jesus.

During these days, the church had walked in fellowship with Christ, loving Him and proclaiming the Gospel boldly within the city, with great effect.

They must themselves and their current condition in light of this.

2. The church is to repent of their lost love and return to fellowship with Christ so that they might once again love others in light of their love for Him.

"repent"— $\mu\epsilon\tau\alpha\nuo\epsilon\omega$ (metanoe \bar{o})— To change one's mind. To agree with what God has spoken and to respond accordingly.

The Consequence of Unrepentance

Rev. 2:5b—If not, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place, unless you repent.

• The promise of Christ is that He will come in judgment upon the church if it persists in sin.

Lampstand Imagery:

A Final Commendation

Rev. 2:6—Yet this you have: you hate the works of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

"the Nicolatians"— Little is known for certain about this group. It is possible that that this heretical group was founded by Nicolaus (Acts 6:5). The name is a combination of two Greek words (nikao—to conquer, and laos—people) and means "The people conquerors."

⇒ This group seems to have taught that Christians were free to engage in sinful behavior.

The Prophetic Call & Promise

Rev. 2:7—He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who conquers I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.'

• This final call to heed the Word of the Lord once again recalls the words of the OT prophets (Isa. 6:9-10; Ezek. 3:27).

"the one who conquers"— The one who has true faith and who maintains faithful witness to Christ.

"I will grant to eat of the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God."

Tree of Life Imagery:

Rev. 22:1-3—¹ Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² through the middle of the street of the city; also, on either side of the river, the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, yielding its fruit each month. The leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations. ³ No longer will there be anything accursed, but the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him.
