"The Ultimate Issues Of Life: 'Heaven' Or 'Hell'?"

Part One: "Heaven" - The Eternal Destiny Of The Believer!

Introduction:

Robert Lewis, originator and teacher of *Men's Fraternity*, has said,

"<u>Life</u> as we know it turns on two world views: 1) <u>There's more!</u> . . . after this life; and, 2) **There's nothing more!**"

He further adds:

"Death as we know it offers four possible outcomes: 1) It's over! 2) It's over and everyone will be okay! 3) It's over and I'm good enough for what's next!

4) It's over and I will need help for what is next!

How do we know what happens when we die? Without God's help to answer this ultimate question, we are left to mankind's thoughts and opinions. Historically, these have differed from the atheist on one side to the Bible-believing Christian on the other.

The "<u>atheist</u>" offers the suggestion that since there is no God or spiritual reality, <u>death</u> simply brings "<u>non-existence</u>" – we simply cease to exist! There is no "after-life" or eternal existence. There is no "Heaven" or "Hell". This present human life is all there is!

The modern "universalist" shows the range of opinion by believing in <u>life</u> after death and that all mankind is redeemed!

"... all men are now saved, though all do not know it. Therefore the job of the preacher and the missionary is to tell people that they are already saved. ... God's radical love pursues men until all are saved. ... (Universalists) appeal to the nature of God as being totally love. How, then, they ask, could such a God condemn anyone either in this life or the life to come?" —Charles Ryrie

The "Bible-believing Christian" contends that every human <u>lives</u> after death, but that the redeemed go to "Heaven" and that all others go to "Hell". Jesus said, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me," John 14:6.

A confident and certain answer about what happens when we die demands <u>divine</u> <u>revelation</u>. God must help us! He must reveal to us what we cannot know without His

help. This needed <u>divine revelation</u> is the basic claim of the Bible! It claims to be God's revelation of Himself and His provision of answers to the ultimate questions of life. While this claim seems ludicrous to the "modern mind", it is the foundation for what the Christian believes. The question of "Heaven" and "Hell" are prime examples.

"HEAVEN": The Believer's Eternal Home!

"The Lord promised to prepare a place for His own. At the Rapture and resurrection of the Church the saints of this age are, after judgment (the Judgment Seat of Christ) and marriage (the Marriage Supper of the Lamb), installed in that prepared place. They are joined by the saints of the Old Testament at the time of their resurrection at the Second Advent (Coming). This dwelling place prepared for the 'Bride', in which Old Testament saints find their place as servants (Rev. 22:3), is moved down into the air to remain over the land of Palestine during the Millennium, during which time the saints exercise their right to reign. These saints are in their eternal state and the city (the New Jerusalem) enjoys its eternal glory. At the expiration of the Millennial Age, during the renovation of the earth, the dwelling place is removed during the conflagration, to find its place after the re-creation as the connecting link between the New Heavens and the New Earth."
