Part II

Introduction: God Has Provided Three Things To Enable Effective Ministry.

A. His WORD:

1. II Timothy 3:16-17.

"All Scripture is <u>inspired</u> by God and <u>profitable</u> for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be <u>adequate</u>, <u>equipped</u> for every good work."

2. Hebrews 4:12-13.

"For the Word of God is <u>living</u> and <u>active</u> and <u>sharper</u> than any two-edged sword, and <u>piercing</u> as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to <u>judge</u> the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are open and laid bare to the eyes of Him with whom we have to do."

--Application: God's "Word" does the work!

B. His WILL:

1. Romans 12:2.

"And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may <u>prove</u> what the <u>will of God</u> is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect."

2. Ephesians 2:10.

"For we are His <u>workmanship</u>, created in Christ Jesus for <u>good works</u>, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them."

--Application: God's "Will" is already planned/enabled!

C. His SPIRIT:

1. I Corinthians 6:19-20.

"Or do you not know that your body is a <u>temple</u> of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."

2. I Corinthians 2:12.

"Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God."

--Application: The Holy Spirit "Indwells" and "Enables"!

The "Spiritual Gifts"

I. The "Definition" of a Gift:

"A 'Spiritual Gift' is a divine enablement of a special ability for service upon a member of the Body of Christ." --William McRae

A. The N.T. words:

- 1. "Gift" = pneumatikos → I Cor. 12:1.
 - "Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I do not want you to be unaware."
 - --<u>Gr. text</u>: "Now concerning <u>spirituals</u> . . . (gifts)

 <u>pneumatikos</u> = from <u>pneuma</u> ("spirit") meaning "spiritual"
 - -- Meaning: They are divine in their source!
 - --<u>App</u>: This "<u>spiritual</u>" source (supernatural) → not believed in our day! **Every Believer has a "divine enblement" from the Holy Spirit!**
- 2. "Gift" = charisma → I Cor. 12:4.
 - "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit."
 - --<u>Gr. text</u>: <u>charisma</u> = from <u>charis</u> ("grace") + suffix "<u>ma</u>" indicating the result of "grace" → "A gift of grace; an undeserved benefit of grace."
 - --Meaning: The essence of a spiritual gift = <u>an ability!</u>

 It is an <u>ability</u> to function effectively and significantly in a particular service as a member of Christ's body, the Church.
 - --<u>App</u>: Every "Assembly" of Believers is composed of individuals who are gifted/enabled by God to serve Him effectively!

B. What a "gift" embodies: (From William McRae)

1. "Ability":

"Ability in any sphere of the Lord's service, <u>ability that enables</u> one to do an effective work that glorifies God and advances the cause of Christ."

2. "Qualification":

"A Believer is qualified to serve in the work of God, not initially on the basis of human ability or training, but on the basis of the "gift" of God given to him/her."

3. "Strength":

"A Believer who possesses a divine, supernatural supply of strength to minister."

4. "Responsibility":

"It naturally flows that if a gift is a divine endowment, then it surely involves <u>responsibility</u>. It is a <u>stewardship</u> – we stand responsible for our use of the time, money, bodies, and opportunities that have been entrusted to us. We are accountable for how we have invested the gift entrusted to us."

C. What about natural "talents"?

- --It is imperative that we distinguish between a "spiritual gift" and a "natural talent".
- --Natural "Talents": Are given by God as well as spiritual gifts!
 - 1. They are derived from parents and family lineage.
 - 2. They are possessed by "Believers" and "Non-believers".
 - 3. They are possessed from birth.
 - 4. They are part of God's "common grace" to all of His creation for the mutual benefit of mankind.

"Such talents may and ought to be <u>dedicated</u> to God to be used for His glory and in His service, but they must always be considered <u>consecrated</u> <u>talents</u>, <u>not spiritual gifts</u>." --William McRae

<u>Helpful Questions</u>: Distinguishing <u>Natural Talents</u> and <u>Spiritual Gifts</u>.

- -- "Does a <u>natural talent</u> become a <u>spiritual gift</u> at the point of conversion?"

 <u>No!</u> Spiritual "power" and "blessing" are missing where there is natural talent only (as a source).
- -- "Can there be an <u>overlap</u> between a <u>spiritual gift</u> and a <u>natural talent</u>."

 Yes! A natural talent can be the "channel" for the exercise of a spiritual gift, but never the "source"!

II. The "Distribution" of the Gifts:

"The <u>distribution of the gifts</u> is a work so profound, so important, so extensive, that it involved the entire Godhead. This places the distribution of spiritual gifts in the same category as the work of <u>creation</u> and <u>redemption</u>. In each case, <u>all three Persons</u> of the Trinity are active."

—William McRae

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1. The source of all "Spiritual Gifts" is Jesus Christ, 4:7.

- a. Paul → Eph. 1: 3, "... who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ."
- b. <u>Peter</u> → II Pet. 1:3, "... His divine power has granted to us <u>everything</u> that pertains to <u>life</u> and <u>godliness</u> ..."
- 2. The ascended Christ now reigns in majestic glory and power, 4:8.

"Therefore it says, 'WHEN HE ASCENDED ON HIGH,
HE LED CAPTIVE A HOST OF CAPTIVES,
AND HE GAVE GIFTS TO MEN.' " (Psa. 68:18)

- a. This quotation from Psalm 68:18 is "______" of Messiah.

 The one who had been <u>held</u> captive has now <u>conquered</u> and now holds all authority!
- b. Proper interpretation requires understanding of the ancient "<u>Triumph</u>" or "Victory March".
- c. The "<u>ascension</u>" of Jesus Christ back to Heaven, after the humiliation of His death on the cross, is an historic portrayal of Christ entering into the glory of Heaven and rewarding "His own"!
 - "(Paul) sees Christ's ascension as a triumphant <u>victory march</u> into heaven. Now seated upon the throne, the Conqueror is distributing spiritual gifts to His people, gifts that are the '<u>spoils of Calvary</u>'. . . . These gifts have been purchased by His precious blood. They are the result of the Cross. The

believer who realizes this will appreciate their value. These gifts are extremely costly. They cost Jesus Christ His life." --William McRae

3. God-given "dignity" is attached to the spiritual gifts Christ gives to "His own", 4:9-11.

"(Now this expression, 'He ascended,' what does it mean except that He also had descended into the lower parts of the earth? He who descended is Himself also He who ascended <u>far above</u> all the heavens, so that <u>He might fill all things</u>.) And He gave some as apostles, and some as prophets, and some as evangelists, and some as pastors and teachers . . ."

"Your spiritual gift, whatever it is, has constituted you a part of the ministry. To be in the ministry of Jesus Christ, serving Him, is a matter of <u>dignity</u> because you have been <u>qualified</u>, <u>called</u>, and <u>equipped</u> to engage in that ministry by means of something <u>the ascended Christ</u> has given you. . . . What <u>dignity</u> there is in being entrusted with a faculty for service from the glorified Master Himself."

d. Your gift is essential to the proper ______ of the Body of Christ. "The metaphor chosen by the Holy Spirit and used by Paul in I Corinthians 12 to describe the local church is the physical body. Nothing is clearer from this metaphor than the fact that each member of the body has a particular role

which is essential for the efficient functioning of the entire body." --W. McRae

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"But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good."

I Corinthians 12:7

Two serious errors exist in the Church today:

- 1. Christians who believe that "spiritual gifts" are given for **self-edification**.
 - --Self-edification is not a Biblical goal of the exercise of spiritual gifts.

 The Greek text of I Cor. 13:5 says, "Love seeketh not the things of itself."

- 2. Christians who withhold their "spiritual gift" from benefiting the Body.
 - --Whether intentional or unintentional, not functioning in the Body results in impoverishment of the Local Assembly a vital part is missing!

D. Gifts are distributed by the " ministry of the Holy Spirit.

"But one and the same <u>Spirit</u> works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills."

I Corinthians 12:11

--The distribution of the "spiritual gifts" is a sovereign act →

"No one dictates to the Dispenser! He does as He wills!"

"Why has He chosen to give you a particular gift? . . . It is because this particular gift fits you most perfectly for His plan and purpose for your life. Few things are more important for a Christian than knowing what his or her gift is. That knowledge will often be a signpost pointing the believer in the direction of God's will in specific instances. One of the most obvious indicators of God's will for your life is your gift. . . . The believer who grasps the sovereignty of God in this area of life, as well as in every other area, will be delivered from a complaining spirit. He will learn to be content and grateful, rejoicing in the Lord always. God is the One who has given us our gifts. It was His sovereign, wise, all-knowing choice."

E. Gifts are given at the time of " ".

- 1. The "gifts" are given by the Holy Spirit.
 - --We do not receive the Holy Spirit until the moment of salvation, I Cor. 6:19-20. "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."
- 2. The "gifts" are given for the benefit of the Body of Christ.
 - --We are not in the Body until our salvation, I Cor. 12:13.
 - "For by one Spirit we were all <u>baptized into one body</u>, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slave or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit."

F. Gifts are distributed on the basis of God's " ".

- --If there were any other <u>basis</u> other than "grace", they would cease to be <u>gifts!</u>

 "But to each one of us <u>grace</u> was given according to the measure of Christ's gift."

 Ephesians 4:7
- -- This basis of "grace" guards against two evil extremes:
- Arrogant Pride → Giving credit to "self" for what God has provided!
 "For through the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think
 more highly of himself than he ought to think; but to think so as to have sound
 judgment, as God has allotted to each a measure of faith."
 Romans 12:3
- 2. False Humility → Thinking that it is wrong to claim to have a spiritual gift!
