Revelation & Visual Imagery

The Vision of the Son of Man—Rev. 1:12-16

1. Jesus is portrayed as the who tends the lampstands in the temple of God.

Rev. 1:12-13a— 12 Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, ³ and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man,

2. Jesus is portrayed as the sovereign ______ who has the same authority as God Almighty.

Rev. 1:13b-16a—clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest.¹⁴ The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, ¹⁵ his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters.¹⁶ In his right hand he held seven stars,

3. Jesus is portrayed as the who proclaims the Word of God to the churches.

Rev. 1:16b—from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

Jesus' Prophetic Warnings to the Churches

- - 1. The "earth-dwellers" will always first seek to entice believers into idolatry and compromise.

Rev. 2:14—But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality.

- Should believers fall into these temptations, they lose their ability to stand as effective \Rightarrow to the Word of God and the testimony of Jesus.
- 2. If believers refuse to compromise themselves, they will at times face persecution from the world.

Rev. 2:3—I know you are enduring patiently and bearing up for my name's sake, and you have not grown weary.

Rev. 2:9— "I know...the slander of those who say that they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan.

Rev. 2:13b—you did not deny my faith even in the days of Antipas my faithful witness, who was killed among you, where Satan dwells.
