The End of the Matter (12:13-14)

Eccl. 12:13-14—¹³ The end of the matter; all has been heard. Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man. ¹⁴ For God will bring every deed into judgment, with every secret thing, whether good or evil.

I. The conclusion of Solomon's life quest was the realization that man's primary purpose was to know and worship God. (12:13)

<u>Job 42:2-6</u>—² "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. ³ "Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?" Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. ⁴ 'Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you make it known to me." I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; ⁶ therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes."

The Words of the One Shepherd are the Words of the Good Shepherd

• Jesus identified Himself as the True Shepherd of God's people

<u>John 10:11</u>—"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." <u>John 14:15</u>—"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."

• Jesus came into the world to identify with mankind so that we might find our ultimate identity in worshiping Him and our ultimate purpose in obeying Him.

<u>I Pet. I:14-19</u>—¹⁴ As obedient children, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, ¹⁵ but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, ¹⁶ since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ¹⁷ And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile, ¹⁸ knowing that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.
