Why was Cain's offering unacceptable?

THEORY #1

Was it a technical offense?

THEORY #2

Was it the quality of the offering?

"In the course of time Cain brought to the Lord an offering of the fruit of the ground, and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions."

THEORY #3

Was it just the sovereign choice of God?

THEORY #4

Was it the man that made the offering unacceptable?

"And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering he had no regard."

GENESIS 4:4-5

"So Cain was very **angry**, and his face fell."

GENESIS 4:5

The Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen?

If you do well, will you not be accepted?"

GENESIS 4:6-7

"And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is contrary to you, but you must rule over it."

GENESIS 4:7

Cain had a **sin** problem. Cain had a **heart** problem. Cain had a **"master"** problem.
