Matthew 10:16-39 — The Cost of Following Jesus

The Sending Out of The Twelve

- The wider context of this passage is Jesus' commissioning of the Twelve Apostles for the purpose of proclaiming the coming of the kingdom (with Jesus as Messiah/King) as well as demonstrating its power by casting out demons and healing diseases.
- The wider body of instruction places particular emphasis on the reality of persecution and has application for all of Jesus' followers who are commissioned by Him for ministry (Matt. 28:18-20).

Matthew 10:16-25

1. Jesus warns the disciples that carrying out His commission will result in *persecution*.

2. Followers of Jesus must endure *faithfully* as His witnesses even as they are hated for the sake of His name.

3. Their experience of persecution is directly linked to their *relationship* to Christ.

Key Point: Followers of Jesus must expect ______ in both word and deed as they seek to live as His witnesses.

Matthew 10:26-33

1. As Jesus' witnesses, they must not *fear* those who would persecute them, but must instead *fear* God.

2. The willingness to *deny* Jesus before others is an ominous sign.

Key Point: The confidence to live as Jesus' witnesses is not derived from the ______ of our lives but instead from our worship of the Lord.

Matthew 10:34-39

³⁴ "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. ³⁵ For I have come to SET A MAN AGAINST HIS FATHER, AND A DAUGHTER AGAINST HER MOTHER, AND A DAUGHTER-IN-LAW AGAINST HER MOTHER-IN-LAW. ³⁶ And A PERSON'S ENEMIES WILL BE THOSE OF HIS OWN HOUSEHOLD. ³⁷ Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. ³⁸ And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. ³⁹ Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

1. Jesus *clarifies* for His followers the intended effect of His mission.

2. Jesus grounds this statement with a partial quotation from the prophet Micah.

<u>Micah 7:5-6</u>—⁵ Put no trust in a neighbor; have no confidence in a friend; guard the doors of your mouth from her who lies in your arms;⁶ for <u>the</u> son treats the father with contempt, the daughter rises up against her mother, the daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; a man's enemies are the men of his own house.

- ⇒ He also intends for His followers to draw a ______ between themselves and the persecuted prophet. <u>Micah 7:7</u>—But as for me, I will look to the Lord; I will wait for the God of my salvation; my God will hear me.

3. The key *implication* of Jesus' teaching is that His followers must live as His witnesses even to the detriment of their deepest of family relationships.

 \Rightarrow Recall that Jesus Himself experienced these exact kinds of difficulties during His earthly life.

<u>Mark 3:20-21</u>²⁰ Then he went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹ And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind."

4. Jesus illustrates the difficulty of this using the imagery of *death*.

<u>Mark 3:31-35</u>—³¹ And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. ³² And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you." ³³ And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" ³⁴ And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵ <u>For</u> whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

<u>1 Pet. 1:14-17</u>—¹⁴ "<u>As obedient children</u>, do not be conformed to the passions of your former ignorance, ¹⁵ but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, ¹⁶ since it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ¹⁷ And <u>if you call on him as Father</u> who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, conduct yourselves with fear throughout the time of your exile…"
