Introduction: The Immanence & Transcendence of God

"Transcendence and immanence are not separable in the [Christian] faith. The very One who is beyond the finite and human is intimately manifested and warmly knowable within the human sphere." Thomas Oden, Classic Christianity

Although we can truly know God, there are aspects of that knowledge that remain mysterious to us. We must keep this in mind as we consider the Persons of the Godhead and their works. What is true of the Triune God is true of each of the Persons of the Godhead.

Key Point: Christians rightly profess faith in The First Person of the Godhead, the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Father becomes _" Father in Heaven when we are united to His Son by faith!

The "Fatherhood" of God

1. As Creator, there is a sense in which God is the *father* of all mankind.

Mal. 2:10a—Have we not all one Father? Has not one God created us?

Acts 17:28—for "'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, "For we are indeed his offspring."

2. Being God's *children* in a generic sense does not mean that people are in right relationship with Him.

Rom. 2:5 — But because of your hard and impenitent heart you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath when God's righteous judgment will be revealed.

The First Person of the Godhead: The Father

"It has too often been assumed that all systems which recognize God at all, agree with the Christian system to the extent that the First Person is shared by all, that is, the Christian belief is satisfied if two other Persons are added to the One God whom all are supposed to acknowledge alike...but the One God is that whole Essence which subsists as Father, Son, and Spirit..." — L.S.
