RIVERWOOD BIBLE CHURCH THE SOVEREIGNTY OF GOD DEFINED Ron Scarbrough – April 19, 2020

Objective - I hope that you will leave this service today with a refreshed awareness of this overarching attribute of our great God, so that you will enjoy a new depth of love and awe and reverence for Him who alone is utterly Sovereign.

The Big Question: Who is regulating affairs on earth today, God or Satan? Two things beyond dispute: God is the Sovereign Creator; Man is a responsible creature.

That God reigns supreme in <u>Heaven</u> is generally conceded; that He does so over this <u>world</u> is almost universally denied – if not directly, then indirectly.

Q. Doesn't everything we <u>see</u> seem to show that the Devil has far more to do with the affairs of earth than God? A. Depends. Are we walking by faith or by sight?

God's Word asserts not only that there are no limits to His *ability* to act, there are also no limits to His *authority* to act.

"Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, indeed everything that is in the heavens and the earth; Yours is the dominion, O Lord, and You exalt Yourself as head over all." (I Chronicles 29:11)

The Sovereignty of God is said to be <u>absolute</u>, <u>irresistible</u>, <u>infinite</u>

It is His *right* to govern the universe He made just as He pleases.

It is the right of the Potter over the clay. "Woe to the one who quarrels with his Maker!" (Isa. 45:9) He is under no rule or law outside of His own will and nature.

He is Sovereign in the <u>exercise of His power</u>.

He exercises it <u>as</u> He wills, <u>when</u> he wills, and <u>where</u> He wills.

He is Sovereign in the <u>delegation of His power</u>.

God is Sovereign, and being Sovereign, He does as He pleases.

He is Sovereign in the <u>exercise of His mercy</u>. "I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion." (Romans 9:15)

He is Sovereign in the <u>exercise of His love</u>. "...*In love* He predestined us to adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the *kind intention of His will*." (Eph.1:4b-5)

He is Sovereign in the <u>exercise of His grace</u>.

Grace is favor shown to the undeserving; Grace is the antithesis of justice. Justice demands the impartial enforcement of law, requires each to receive his legitimate due. Justice bestows no favors, is no respecter of persons, shows no pity and knows no mercy.

"Shall not the Judge of all the earth deal justly?" (Genesis 18:25b)
