Introduction

• As relational beings who bear God's image, we have personal relationships and responsibilities that have been entrusted to us in order that they might be cultivated for God's glory. Because we are sinners who live in a fallen world, we need God's Word to give to us both <u>a vision</u> for this work of cultivation and <u>a framework</u> by which to rightly order these relationships and responsibilities. Through the person and work of the Jesus Christ, we are reconciled to God. It is our relationship to Him that is therefore the primary relationship in life which impacts all others and by which they are all rightly prioritized.
