God's Purposes for a Child

<u>Psa. 127:3-5</u>—³ Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward. ⁴ Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth. ⁵ Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them! He shall not be put to shame when he speaks with his enemies in the gate.

Observations:

- 1. A child should be understood as a tangible means by which God **blesses** His people. *"heritage" "reward"*
- 2. A child is given intentionally by God to serve His particular <u>purposes</u>. *"arrows"*
- 3. A child provides future <u>security</u> for parents. *"quiver"*

Key Point: Parents are to care for their children when they are <u>young</u> and children are to care for their parents when they are <u>old</u>.

The Basic Needs of a Child

1. Security

<u>Psa. 128:1-3</u>—¹ Blessed is everyone who fears the Lord, who walks in his ways!² You shall eat the fruit of the labor of your hands; you shall be blessed, and it shall be well with you.³ Your wife will be like a fruitful vine within your house; your children will be like olive shoots around your table.

Question: Am I wanted?

2. Self-Worth

<u>Gen. 1:27-28a</u>—²⁷ So God created man in his own image, <u>in the image of God he created him</u>; male and female he created them. ²⁸ And <u>God blessed them</u>. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion...

Question: Do I have personal <u>value</u>?

3. Structure (Discipline)

Prov. 22:15—Folly is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of discipline drives it far from him.

Question: How should I live?

A Word of Warning

Observations:

- It is possible for parents to wound/break the <u>spirit</u> of their children.
 "provoke"—ἐρεθίζω (*erethizō*)—Prolonged stimulation or provocation (presumably to anger).
- It is possible for parents to cause their children to lose <u>heart</u>.
 "discouraged"—άθυμέω (*athymeō*)— to lose heart; to be spiritless or dismayed.
- Key Point: Just as parents can play a major role in leading their children to love the Lord, they can also <u>turn</u> their children from Him through their consistent patterns of sin.
