A Kind & Gracious People Ephesians 4:32 & Thoughts the Year Ahead

Introduction

- As we consider the prior year and look forward to the year ahead as individuals and families, we should also give time to consider what kind of people God has called us to be. God has intended that His people would be formed and shaped by His Word and Spirit and He has intended for that to happen within a local body of believers (church).
- God has been exceedingly good to our church throughout its history, allowing us to proclaim the Gospel of His grace while conforming us into a people who are characterized by that same grace. We must not, however, take that for granted!

Main Point: In a world that increasingly lacks grace, we who have heard and believed the gospel of God's grace have an opportunity to ______ that grace in our relationships, both inside and outside of the church.

Living as a Gospel Formed People — Ephesians 4:32

The Wider Context: Ephesians was written by Paul so that believers might know that which is true of them in Christ (Eph. 1-3) and might therefore live as the church of Jesus Christ in accordance with that truth (Eph. 4-6).

Eph. 1:3—Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places

Eph. 4:1—I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called

The Immediate Context: 4:17-32 includes a series of contrasts. As those who are in Christ, believers should be characterized by the actions of the "new self" and should put off the "old self" (4:22-24). Of specific concern to Paul is how believers speak to and about one another (4:25-30), with both our attitudes and actions in view (4:31-32).

Eph. 4:30-31—³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.

<u>Eph. 4:32</u> *"Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."*

Important Observations:

1. The verse has a clear grammatical structure:

Imperative (Command): "Be kind to one another, [be] tenderhearted...

What does that look like? ...forgiving one another ...

In what way? ... as God in Christ forgave you."

2. The command focuses on that which should characterize us as believers in relation to one another:

Be: kind—γρηστός (*chrēstos*)—Of things: easy, pleasant, good; of people: kind, benevolent.

Luke 6:35—But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil.

Rom. 2:4—Or do you presume on the riches of his kindness and forbearance and patience, not knowing that God's kindness is meant to lead you to repentance?

Matt. 11:30—For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

<u>1 Pet. 2:3</u>—if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

tenderhearted—εὕσπλαγχνος (*eusplagchnos*)—Lit. good bowels; fig. compassionate or tender-hearted.

In the ancient world, the bowels were considered the seat of the violent passions (anger, love), but the \Rightarrow Hebrews considered them the seat of the tender affections (compassion, tender mercies, etc.), hence their association with the "heart."

1 Pet. 3:8—Finally, all of you, have unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart, and a humble mind.

- Key Point: Kindness and a tender heart should characterize both our and towards one another.

3. Kindness and compassion are shown most clearly in the act of forgiveness.

forgiving—χαρίζομαι (charizomai)—To do something pleasant; to give graciously or freely; to forgive, restore, preserve.

Rom. 8:32—He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?

<u>Col. 2:13</u>—And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having <u>forgiven</u> us all our trespasses,
