



Introduction: Behind the Seen

Gen. 50:19-21—¹⁹ But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? ²⁰ As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. ²¹ So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

Main Point: Although God is sovereign over all things, He permits His creatures in the seen and unseen realms to work either with or against Him as He accomplishes His plans and purposes in the world.

The Revelation of the Fourth Vision to Daniel—Dan. 10:1-11:1

The Historical & Prophetic Context

- Cyrus the Great conquered Babylon in 538 BC, with rule of the province given to Darius the Mede (likely his uncle, Cyaxares II).
 - "Cyrus shared power with a Median king until about two years after the fall of Babylon...Cyrus was Darius' co-regent, the hereditary king of the realm of Persia, the crown prince of Media, and the commander of the Medo-Persian army...Darius died naturally...and as he had no male heir and Cyrus had married his daughter, Cyrus inherited his position upon his death and untied the Median and Persian kingdoms..."—Pierre Briant
- Daniel's prayer of confession and supplication to the Lord regarding Jerusalem was partially answered soon after he received his third vision (Dan. 9:1-27).
 - 1. The Decree of Cyrus (538 BC) Ezra 1:1-4.
 - 2. The Work of Rebuilding (537 BC) Ezra 3:1-6
 - 3. Opposition & the Halting of the Work (527 BC) Ezra 4:1-5

Ezra 4:4-5—4 Then the peoples around them set out to discourage the people of Judah and make them afraid to go on building. 5 They bribed officials to work against them and frustrate their plans during the entire reign of Cyrus king of Persia and down to the reign of Darius king of Persia.

Key Point: This was a time of much political wrangling within the Persian government regarding policy for dealing with the nation of Israel.

The Immediate Circumstances of the Vision (10:1-4)

Observations

I. The author gave a summary of the nature of the vision and Daniel's understanding of it.

"it was a great conflict"

"he understood the word and had understanding of the vision"

- 2. Daniel had concluded a time of mourning when the vision came to him.
 - ⇒ The first month (*Nissan*) was the time of the year where the Jews celebrated both the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread. This was a time for the people to reflect on God's salvation and the celebrate His goodness.

"In light of the historical context, it is reasonable to assume that Daniel was deeply troubled over the sad turn of events incurred by the Jews who had returned to the land of Judah and that had brought the rebuilding of the temple to a halt (Ezra 4:4-5). What had been for a moment a cause of rejoicing...had now turned to disappointment."—J. Paul Tanner

Key Point: The revelation of the vision came in response to Daniel's <u>concern</u> for Israel in light of the political circumstances and the conflicts that had been depicted in his prior visions.

The Vision of the Son of Man & the Message of the Angel

Observations

I. Daniel saw a figure that appeared to be both **human** and **divine**.

"a man clothed in linen with a belt of fine gold" His clothing gave was similar to that of an OT priest.

"his face was like the appearance of lighting" His face shown with a divine <u>radiance</u> (Matt. 17:2)

"his eyes were like flaming torches"

He sees with a piercing intensity.

"his arms and legs like the gleam of burnished bronze" He is proven <u>true</u> and faithful like metal that has been refined.

"the sound of his words like...a multitude" He speaks with **power** and **authority**.

Key Point: Given the similarities to Rev. 1:12-17, this should be recognized as the Preincarnate Christ.
