## The Kings of the North & South—Dan. 11:2-20

"Dan. II:2-12:4 forms the heart of God's "message" to Daniel in response to his fasting and prayers. In this message, God reveals to Daniel a glimpse of the nation's future history in two parts, both of which will be full of warfare and conflicts. The first part (II:2-35) traces the history of the nation from the time of Daniel (under Cyrus' reign until the second century BC. For most of this period, Judah is caught up in the struggle between two larger powers: the Seleucid Empire to the north and the Ptolemaic Empire to the south. The struggle culminates with Antiochus IV Epiphanes coming to the Seleucid throne, under whose reign the Jews are severely persecuted." —J. Paul Tanner
