### Part 23 — "The Hope of Resurrection" — 20 November 2022

#### **Introduction:**

Having been told of the antagonists who were to come in both the near and distant future, the angel then spoke to Daniel of God's coming deliverance. Although persecution and death lay ahead for Daniel's people, there was reason for hope on both a corporate and individual level.
Main Point: The ultimate hope of God's people is found in our which He has promised and in which He has purposed to both reward and bless us eternally.
Tribulation & Resurrection—Dan. 12:1-12:13
The Prophetic Context
1. Daniel has been given insight into the ongoing battle within the realm.  Dan. 10:20—Then he said, "Do you know why I have come to you? But now I will return to fight against the prince of Persia; and when I go out, behold, the prince of Greece will come.
2. Daniel has been given a message concerning what would happen to his people in the
⇒ Antagonists will arise and God's people will experience seasons of intense persecution:
(1) Under Antiochus IV Epiphanes (Dan. 11:21-35)
(2) Under Antichrist (Dan 11:36-44) during he 70th Week (Tribulation)
Key Point: Although the message of the angel concerned great conflict, the presence of the figure served as a remind of God's sovereignty over these events and His power to deliver them.
<u>Dan. 12:1</u> —"At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, suc as never has been since there was a nation till that time. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book.
The Promise of Resurrection (12:2-4)
Observations
1. Though many would perish during this period of persecution, the message concluded with the promise of resurrection.
$\Rightarrow$ The resurrection is ultimately a of the punishment given to our first parents following their sin.
Gen. 3:19—"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, until you return to the ground, because from it you were taken; for you are <u>dust</u> and to dust you shall return."
Dan. 12:22—And many of those who sleep in the <u>dust</u> of the <u>ground</u> will awake

<u>Dan. 12:3</u>—And those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky above; and those who turn many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever.

- ⇒ Given that these are Jewish believers living during the time of the Tribulation who point others to Christ, this passage may have the 144,000 (Rev. 7:4; 14:1-5) in view.
  - "...they are "wise"...because they have set their minds on the Word of God and have learned to apply it to life's situations, especially times of crisis. By their instruction they help bring many to righteousness, i.e., they instruct them about God's way of being righteous and point them to Messiah Jesus in whom one is made righteous by faith." —J. Paul Tanner

3. The message concluded with an exhortation to Daniel regarding the book and the prophecy that it included.

"shut up the words and seal the book"

Believers

### Further Questions & Personal Comfort (12:5-13)

Observations

- Daniel saw two other angelic beings who asked the divine figure how \_\_\_\_\_\_ this time of persecution under the end-time Antagonist would last.
- 2. The divine/human figure then swore an \_\_\_\_\_ and answered the angel's question.
  - ⇒ The time period would be roughly 3 1/2 years ('a time, times, and half a time' 7:25) at which time Israel would finally be humbled from her pride and rebellion and be ready to receive Messiah.
- 3. Daniel then asked the divine/human figure about the ultimate \_\_\_\_\_\_ of these events.
  - "Daniel was asking, not about all the events related to Antichrist's persecution of Israel, but about the last event related to that persecution—namely, the final deliverance of Israel as foretold...in Dan. 12:1. Daniel wanted an explanation of how that deliverance would be accomplished."



5. The divine/human figure concluded His words to Daniel with a message of personal \_\_\_\_\_\_.

"you shall rest" "you shall stand in you allotted place"

Key Point: The consummate deliverance of God's people will come in the form of resurrection because \_\_\_\_\_ is the great enemy of them serving God in the world that He has made.

# Implications for Eschatology (Future Events)

<u>I Cor. 15:21-26</u>—<sup>21</sup> For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive. <sup>23</sup> But each in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. <sup>24</sup> Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father after destroying every rule and every authority and power. <sup>25</sup> For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. <sup>26</sup> The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

#### The Order of the Resurrections

- I. Christ (Matt. 28:6) 2. The Church (I Thess. 4:16) 3. OT & Trib. Saints (Rev. 20:4) 4. Kingdom Saints 5. Unsaved Dead (Rev. 20:5)
- ⇒ Associated with these resurrections will be judgments whereby believers are judged for the purpose of rewards so that they might continue in service to the Lord during the Millennial Kingdom and into the New Creation.

## Living Faithfully in "Babylon"

• The sovereign God has given us new \_\_\_\_\_ in Christ, and He will bring that work of salvation to completion in our resurrection.

Phil. 1:6—And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

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<u>Main Point</u>: The ultimate hope of God's people is found in our <u>resurrection</u> which He has promised and in which He has purposed to both reward and bless us eternally.

## The Prophetic Context

I. Daniel has been given insight into the ongoing battle within the spiritual realm.

Dan. 10:20—Then he said, "Do you know why I have come to you? But now I will return to fight against the prince of Persia; and when I go out, behold, the prince of Greece will come.

    - (I) Under Antiochus IV Epiphanes (Dan. II:21-35)
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Dan. 12:1—"At that time shall arise Michael, the great prince who has charge of your people. And there shall be a time of trouble, such as never has been since there was a nation till that time. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone whose name shall be found written in the book.

## The Promise of Resurrection (12:2-4)

#### Observations

- 1. Though many would perish during this period of persecution, the message concluded with the promise of resurrection.
  - ⇒ The resurrection is ultimately a <u>reversal</u> of the punishment given to our first parents following their sin.

Gen. 3:19—"By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread, until you return to the ground, because from it you were taken; for you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Dan. 12:2a—And many of those who sleep in the <u>dust</u> of the <u>ground</u> will awake...


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
