Introduction: The Social Imaginary

All people have particular beliefs about the world, themselves, and how they are to live. These assumptions or presuppositions are often referred to as a worldview. In recent years, however, the term social imaginary has become a popular way to describe how people understand the world and choose to live within it because it emphasizes feeling and intuition as well as belief.

"...the social imaginary is a somewhat amorphous concept precisely because it refers to the myriad beliefs, practices, normative expectations, and even implicit assumptions that members of a society share that shape their daily lives. It is not so much a conscious philosophy of life as a set of intuitions and practices. In sum, the social imaginary is the way people think about the world, how they imagine it to be, how they act intuitively in relation to it..." —Carl Trueman, The Rise & Triumph of the Modern Self

The Challenge of Authenticity

What is lame and counterfeit, that which corrupts authenticity and keeps us from being real or genuine...is worse that that which is evil, demonic or perverse. The Challenge of Expressive Individualism

"Expressive individualism assumes the authority of inner feelings in what it means to be an individual, which has a number of implications: To be truly oneself requires behaving outwardly in a manner consistent with those inner feelings...outward behavior that does not match inner feelings indicates that the outward, social self is not a true reflection of the real, inward self...Happiness and human flourishing tend to be identified with the individual's inner sense of psychological well-being or peace."—Carl Trueman
