### Messiah's Resurrection & Our Salvation-Acts 13:16-41

For the Lord was moved to pity by their groaning because of those who afflicted and oppressed them. <sup>19</sup> But whenever the judge died, they turned back and were more corrupt than their fathers, going after other gods, serving them and bowing down to them.

 $\Rightarrow$  The message of salvation proclaimed to them concerned the death of Jesus at the hands of the religious and political leaders which the prophets foretold.

<u>Isa. 53:7-9a</u>—<sup>7</sup> He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth.<sup>8</sup> By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?<sup>9</sup> And they made his grave with the wicked and with a rich man in his death,

 $\Rightarrow The message of salvation proclaimed to them concerned the resurrection of Messiah which the Scriptures also foretold.$ <u>Acts 13:32b</u>—'*TOU ARE MT SON, TODAT I HAVE BEGOTTEN TOU.*' (PSA. 2:7)

Acts 13:34b—'I WILL GIVE YOU THE HOLT AND SURE BLESSINGS OF DAVID.' (ISA. 55:3)

#### Isaiah 55 →

3. The resurrection of Messiah meant that He was the long awaited King who has gone before His people in order to defeat the greatest of their \_\_\_\_\_\_ (13:36-41)
