Introduction: Light & Anticipation

This time of year is often one of anticipation. As the first Christmas lights are put out, all who see them begin to anticipate what is ahead in the coming weeks. Children are excited for the coming of Christmas morning. Adults look forward to a few days or weeks off work. Family members long to reconnect and spend time together. The small lights that we associate with anticipation, however, point to a much greater reality.
