Believers are exhorted to pursue unity (1 Cor. 1:10), but that is not always an easy thing to do. While some divisions do occur at times because of sin (John 7:43; Gal. 5:20), sometimes they are the result of disagreements where no one is particularly in error (Acts 15:36-41).
